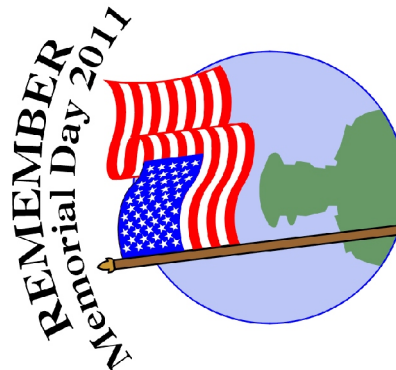

## Part 16 of THE ROTARY GAME

### Who Is This Rotarian?

C. This Rotarian was born in Charleston, South Carolina, and grew up mostly in a very small town in western North Carolina, and over time he lived in five southern states. He was a huge athletics fan growing up; he played basketball in high school and participated in just about every intramural sport in college, from basketball and football to bowling and horseshoes. But he also happens to be accident prone which resulted in his breaking his nose in basketball, tearing a hamstring playing softball, tearing the cartilage in his knees playing volleyball, suffering a concussion getting on a ski lift, and one of the worst was having an excruciatingly painful run-in with a Portuguese Man-O-War while swimming in the Atlantic that required an immediate hospital visit. After that vacation upon returning to Jacksonville, Florida, he became considered a teaching subject for medical students so that they could see what it looks like to get stung by a Man-O-War, showing about a half dozen tentacle marks down his back.
