Part 17 of THE ROTARY GAME Who Is This Rotarian?

C. This Rotarian was born in a log house in the country near Rabbittown, Alabama, and grew up on a farm. He was involved in FFA, public speaking and 4-H in high school and later commuted to JSU. After JSU, he joined the Army and served during the Korean War but didn't have to go overseas. After the Army, he got married. He helped start the Oxford Baseball for Youth league and served as coach, umpire, secretary, and was commissioner of baseball for two years. He served on the Oxford Planning Commission and served seven years as an Oxford City Council member. While he was in Oxford, he was Worshipful Master of the Masonic Lodge and belonged to the Scottish Rite and Shriners, riding a scooter in parades around the state representing the Shriners. He also served for two years as President of COUL (Committee Of United Leadership) which was an organization created to help with peaceful racial integration and to advance racial friendships and healing. He also served as chairman of the board of the Opportunity Center for two years and chairman of the board of the Alabama Leukemia Society. He was a charter member of the Oxford Kiwanis Club and Oxford Quarterback Club and is still active in both. He was a personal friend of George and Lurleen Wallace and visited them at the Governor's Mansion many times during their times in office. And he was, in fact, the county chairman for Lurleen Wallace's campaign when she ran for governor. This Rotarian worked in his last career for decades and during that time was also the president of the statewide association of his peers. This past November he was invited by a longtime friend to participate in one of the Alabama Supreme Court swearing-in ceremonies in Montgomery for the second time, which he says was one of the highest honors of his life. This Rotarian has been married for 57 years and has three children, five grandchildren and two great grandchildren.
