2011 Club Fundraiser Announced: "We're Gonna Walk Around the Park"

The club board of directors approved the club's 2011 fundraising event at its March 8 meeting. The event, a 5-mile walk/run-a-thon with a 50's theme, is chaired by Gary Schoenberg and Jerry Leake. The goal of the walk-a-thon is to raise funds for the club's annual obligations and for donation to local service organizations. It will be held on May 14, from 9 am to 1 pm at the Norwood Hodges Community Center in Golden Springs, and will use the Fred O. Couch "Parcours," a one-mile trail with outer and inner loops.

The event will feature music from the 1950's, grilled hamburgers and hot dogs, soda floats, ice cream, etc., and muscle cars provided by Rotarians, car clubs, and others will have ample room for display. Parking will be available at Sacred Heart Catholic Church, and restrooms, picnic tables, and a playground are available at the community center.

The proposal is to raise funds through pledges per mile. Each walker or runner will be challenged to solicit \$500 in pledges although they have the discretion to alter the pledging to fit the category of donors solicited, e.g., more walkers, less per mile, or a flat rate. In addition, charities benefitting from the walk-a-thon will be asked to actively participate in the event. A representative from each agency will be invited to the March 15 club meeting, which will be followed by a 1 pm kickoff announcing the plan. Corporate sponsorships are also available.
