C. This Rotarian was born in Norfolk, Virginia. He was a Boy Scout, which is where he learned to play the horn after which he became camp bugler. At one point he was responsible for sounding 22 calls exactly on time each day. Later he joined the National Guard at age 16 and became a bugler there. He went on to be educated at William & Mary College, Virginia Polytechnic Institute, the University of Pittsburgh and the University of Tennessee, where he received a masters in chemical engineering. He was a chemist, a college instructor, and later he moved to Germany where he was the

director of technical sales for a major chemical company. And it was a chemical company that brought him to Anniston where he was the consultant for the operations of a large company here. While in that role, he was attending a reception one evening when a female reporter who was also in attendance received a call with a threat to her if she showed up to cover a meeting the following evening that was to be attended by a man associated with a violent organization. She told him she was going anyway and asked if our Rotarian friend wanted to tag along for the adventure. He said, "Sure." He did meet her the next evening to accompany her; and though nothing became of the threat, the two of them began dating and have been married since 1950. He later changed professions and his career path has since wound through the media industry. He graduated from the American Press Institute at Columbia University and was later president of the Alabama Press Association. He has held various positions over the years but is now president of a large family-owned company where he still goes to work every day. Today he and his wife reside in her childhood home here in Anniston. They are members of both the Anniston Country Club and the Mountain Brook Country Club. This Rotarian's wife studied at the University of Norway and is an author. Once each year they take a cruise on a Norwegian ship somewhere in the world.
