His great-grandfather was the first superintendent of Calhoun County Schools. For a period of time this Rotarian made his own Chardonnay and merlot. He shares the same profession as his brother-in-law. He is the father of four children and has four siblings. His mother was the first teacher at the Cerebral Palsy Center. In college at Birmingham-Southern, he walked across the cafeteria and told his future wife, "If you get tired of that jerk, give me a call." She did and she is still with him 30 years later. Morning Rotary was founded by our club his year as president of our Rotary club. He served on our Rotary District's Ambassadorial Scholarship committee 16 years and was chairman three years.

B. This Rotarian grew up in the automobile business - raised in a car dealership. He was an Auburn cheerleader and was sports editor of the *Auburn Plainsman*, the student newspaper. After college he went to Philadelphia to work for the Chrysler Corp. While living up north, he met his wife on a blind date. He still flies his own plane. He is a father and a grandfather. In his free time he enjoys golf and maintaining his collection of antique cars.

C. This Rotarian grew up in Tampa, FL, Savannah, GA and Oxford, AL and attended Georgia Tech. He owned and operated a business that supplied shipping products that went worldwide, including Holland, Vietnam, Saudi Arabia, South America and elsewhere. He once played Johnny Cash in a talent show. He is an elder in the Presbyterian Church. This past spring, he climbed 1185 feet to the top of
