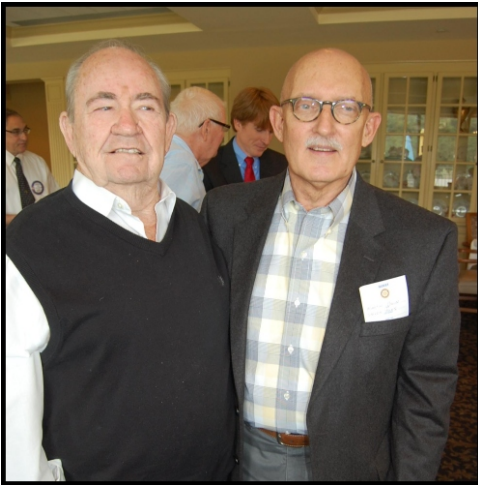

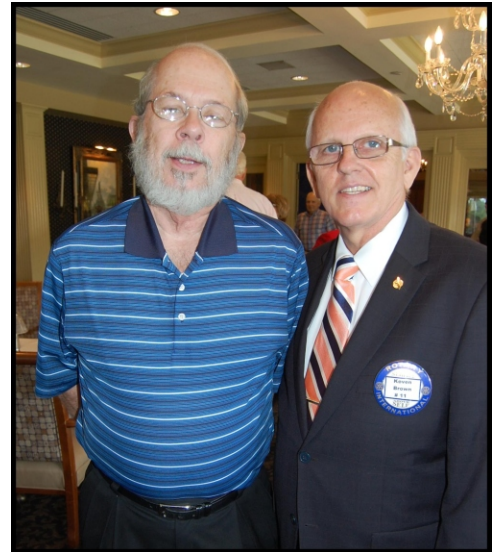
From 21 North, left on Mountain Ave., pass the stadium construction, then left on Woodward Ave. The studios then will be visible.
