Jane Humber, president of the Rotaract Club at JSU, came to the April 7 meeting to report on the club's charity tennis tournament and to thank Rotary and its members for their assistance and participation. Anniston Rotary members contributed \$200. The Rotaract Club raised a total of \$700, exceeding its goal by \$520.

The beneficiary of the proceeds from the tournament is a Columbian charity, NUTRIR, which provides food and after-school programs for children of poverty and offers employment and job skills training for their parents.
