A NOTE FROM ARTHUR YOUNG

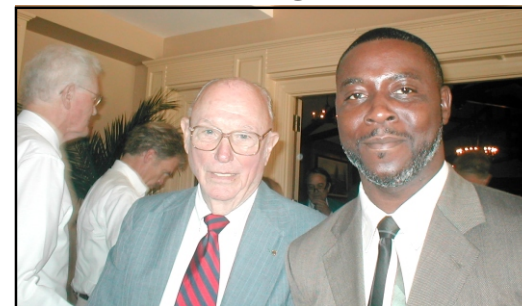
Thanks to everyone for a very successful Rotary year and for helping to Make Dreams Real for children locally and around the world. Special thanks to the officers, members of the board of directors, and the committee chairpersons and members who supported all of the service projects and the Bids for Kids fund-raiser.

Anniston Rotary Club Accomplishments 2008-2009

1. Twenty-two new members for net plus six.
2. Established Anniston Rotary Foundation.
3. Fifteen new Paul Harris Fellows.
4. Bids for Kids auction raised \$26,500+. Recipients were: United Way Imagination Library, \$10,000; Community Enabler, \$2,500; All Saints Center of Concern, \$2,500, Cerebral Palsy of East Central Alabama, \$5,000; and Rotary Foundation Polio Plus, \$5,000.
5. Successful Group Study Exchange with Sao Paulo, Brazil, group. Hosted five team members for four days.
6. Sponsored one GSE team member, Dr. Kennedy Douglas, to tour Sao Paulo for four weeks.
7. District 6860 Vocational Service Award presented to Linda Johns of the CP Center.
8. Three RYLA students sponsored by our club.
9. Laid the groundwork for an International Service Project partnering with SIFAT — clean water and/or literacy.
10. Club donated \$1,000 to Meals of Mercy, local community service project.
11. District Simplified Grant of \$1,000 for Meals of Mercy project.
12. Supported Salvation Army with a Christmas donation.
12. Provided Salvation Army kettle bell ringers.
14. Supported Second Chance gift wrapping project which supports local victims of domestic violence.
15. Supported following agencies with Christmas donation: Community Enabler, All Saints Interfaith Center of Concern, Interfaith Ministries, Calhoun County Board of Education Autism, and Alabama Wesley Society/Groceries with Grace. Total giving \$10,000.
16. Board of directors agreed to support the District 6860 Children's Hospital project. Five year commitment of \$2,500 per year.
